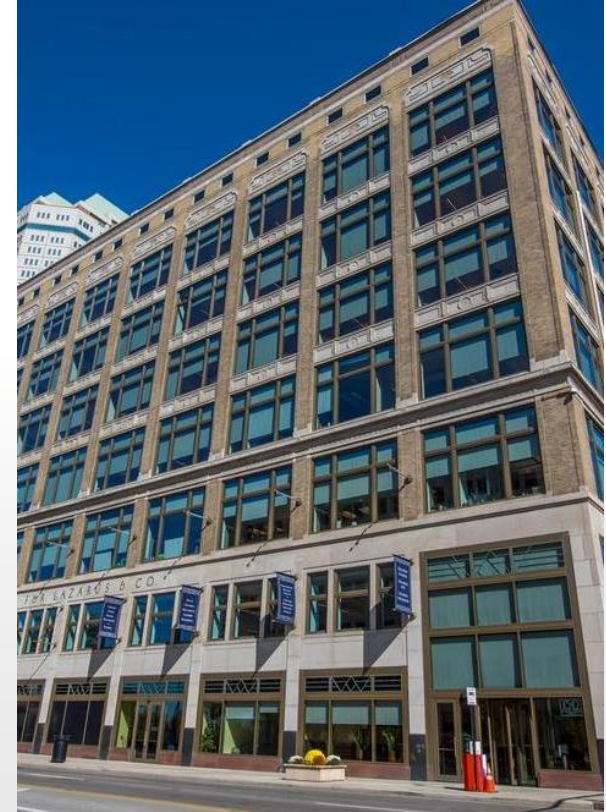

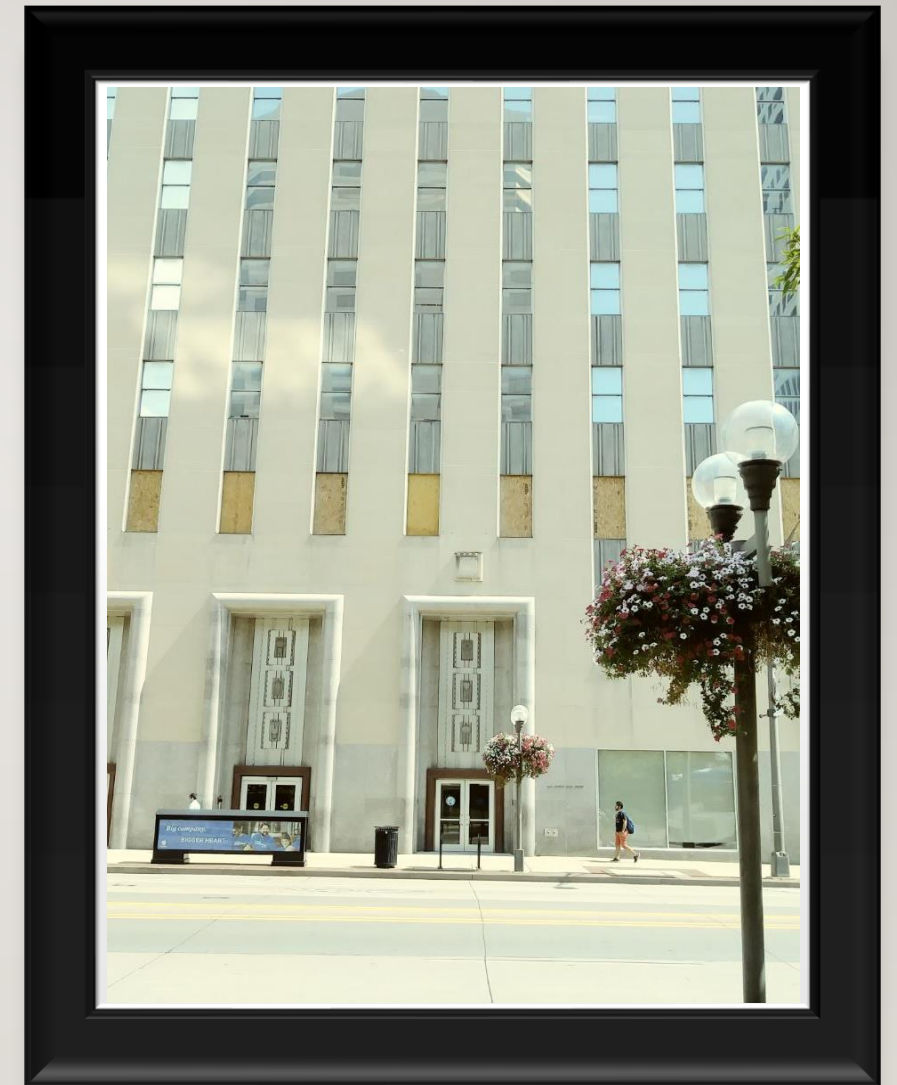

# MISSOURI STATEWIDE POLICY

---

- In 1989, adopted a policy for recycling and waste reduction for state agencies
- In Fiscal Year 2017, \$186,865 to the state recycling fund
- \$296,000 savings
